
Project progress update



Aberaeron Harbour - Andrew Chittock BAM is working in partnership with Ceredigion County Council and AtkinsRéalis Design Consultancy to deliver Aberaeron Coastal Defence Scheme.

I am pleased to report significant progress across several key areas of the project. We have already seen the benefits of the new breakwater during storms earlier in the year.

What have we been doing?

- » Construction of foundation works to capping beam at Toad Hall, river Aeron.
- Completion of masonry cladding and glass panels in front of Y-Seler, river Aeron.
- » Removal of access platform in River Aeron and reinstate rocks.
- » Pwll Cam terrace wall: glass panels and masonry finish as far as we can go, with each tieins to follow in the next period.

Key upcoming works

May:

- » Build new capping beam on river wall in front of Toad Hall.
- » Construction of new wall at the wooden bridge to tie-in to the river Aeron wall and Pwll Cam terrace wall.
- » Construction of steps to the Pwll Cam terrace area.
- » Continuing construction of the new inner harbour gate abutments and kiosk building.
- » Install Quay Parade walls and gate at area adjoining The Hive.
- » Construction of the Quay Parade quayside promenade concrete footpath.
- Continuing construction of the north breakwater concrete walkway and rock placement.
- » Install masonry cladding to the new south pierhead.

The Hive new stone wall and glass panels have been installed.

- » Construction of new inner harbour gate abutments and masonry cladding.
- » Completion of new harbour wall and glass panels to the Hive.
- » Completion of masonry cladding and glass panels along Quay Parade wall. The gate area adjoining The Hive will be completed in the next period.
- » Completion of Quay Parade drainage and road reinstatement.
- » Construction of quayside promenade concrete footpath.
- » On the south beach, commence removal of haul routes and level out beach replenishment.

June:

- » Install glass panels to river wall in front of Toad Hall.
- » Construction of new walls and gate structure at the wooden bridge.
- » Construction of steps and ramp retaining wall to the Pwll Cam terrace area.
- » Installation of new Pwll Cam harbour gate.
- » Final finishings and clearing of works to Quay Parade.
- » Completion of north breakwater concrete walkway and rock placement.
- » Installation of new rock groyne to the south pier.

The new groynes along South Beach have been installed.

- Completion of 3 gates and street
 lighting installation to Quay Parade.
- » Construction of north breakwater and concrete walkway.
- » Completion of south pierhead concrete structure.
- » Completion of south beach new timber groynes and the rock revetment.



July:

- » Complete masonry finishes to Toad Hall, landscape and clear site.
- » Install and commissioning of Pwll Cam harbour gate.
- » Building of the walls and roof to the new kiosk building.
- » Install power supply through Pwll Cam terrace to kiosk.
- » Continue masonry cladding to walls around gate works.
- » Groundworks and hard landscaping to Pwll Cam terrace area.
- » Remove temporary works sheet piling at entrance to inner harbour.
- » Removal of the temporary platforms within the inner harbour.
- » Complete installation of the new rock groyne to the south pier and withdraw haul route access.



Traffic and pedestrian management

We are making every effort to minimise our impact on residents and visitors to Aberaeron while we work on the flood defences. However, there is a need to manage traffic and pedestrians in order to allow us safe working areas and protect the public. The temporary closures listed below remain in place. The coastal path diversion through Aberaeron.

- » The coastal path diversion through Aberaeron.
- » Access onto South Beach.
- » The pedestrian wooden footbridge across the river Aeron.
- » Quay Parade road closure ends on 30th May 2025.
