

Active Travel report 2014/15 – Ceredigion County Council

• Local Transport Fund – Aberystwyth Area Active Travel Package

£100,000 funding secured from Welsh Government (with an additional £30,000 match funding provided by CCC) which provided the following minor improvements:

- Signage improvements on Rhodfa Padarn to Llanbadarn shared use link.
- Removed unnecessary gate frame from path on Parc yr Onnen to Blaendolau link.
- Amended 'kissing style' gate (near Blaendolau Sports field entrance) so that it is now more cycle user friendly.
- Removed steel posts x3 on Rheidol Trail and replaced with cycle bollards x 2.

Following improvements were larger scale:

- (AB6) New on-carriageway and with-flow advisory cycle lane implemented on Riverside Terrace to show this on-road link between off-road sections of the Rheidol Trail, which also forms part of National Cycle Network Route 81 between Shrewsbury and Aberystwyth.

- (AB9 Phase 1) An overgrown and untidy area in between the Starling Cloud and Camau Bach was widened and re-surfaced to provide an improved link to Plascrug Avenue.

- (AB14) Plascrug Avenue 'Phase 1' between Ysgol Gymraeg and Leisure Centre Shared use path widened to new Active Travel Design Guidance standards. 2 number raised table crossings installed. Steel bollards installed to provide safety for cyclists and pedestrians and prevent vehicle parking on paths. Ysgol Gymraeg previously had a cycle shelter with 24 cycle capacity which was insufficient to cope with demand for cycle and scooter storage at the school. This shelter was re-located to Plascrug Leisure Centre and a 60 cycle capacity shelter was installed at Ysgol Gymraeg. Additional speed cushions installed as part of traffic calming with the introduction of a 20 mph Zone.
